### **Mobilarm's Crewsafe V200 makes DSEi debut**

Mobilarm Ltd, the global marine safety supplier, is introducing its Crewsafe V200 submariner Maritime Survivor Locating Device (MSLD) at Defence & Security Equipment International (DSEi) 2011.

Modified under a Sole Source contract to the United States Naval Systems Command ("NAVSEA") for location and rescue of submariners on the surface following escape or abandonment, the Crewsafe V200 is a submariner version of Mobilarm's surface MSLD, the Crewsafe V100. The first of its kind, this compact radio distress beacon transmits individual submariners' GPS positions to rescue forces over long distances using multiple communication systems, including VHF DSC and AIS.

"The Crewsafe V200 meets submarine escape and rescue needs of naval forces worldwide," comments Jon Gething, Defence Manager, Mobilarm. "DSEi is the ideal place to present the Crewsafe V200 to an international defence audience and take our discussions with interested navies further."

Gething joined Mobilarm last year to lead defence projects, following the company's contract win with NAVSEA. A former Submarine Commander for the Royal Navy, Gething's key career milestones include Lead Staff Officer for Submarine Escape Rescue and Abandonment Systems (SMERAS) for the UK and NATO and representing NATO at the forefront of this field.

"The Crewsafe V200 is a significant advancement in submarine escape and rescue systems. Its adoption by defence forces such as the United States Navy will serve to improve submariners' chances of survival on the surface in escape and abandonment situations," comments Lindsay Lyon, CEO, Mobilarm.
